What does the Fund invest in?

This Fund seeks to provide capital appreciation and dividend income by investing in companies from around the world that are expected to pay dividends. Three distinct asset classes are targeted: 50% to Canadian dividend equity, 25% to US dividend equity and 25% to EAFE dividend equity.

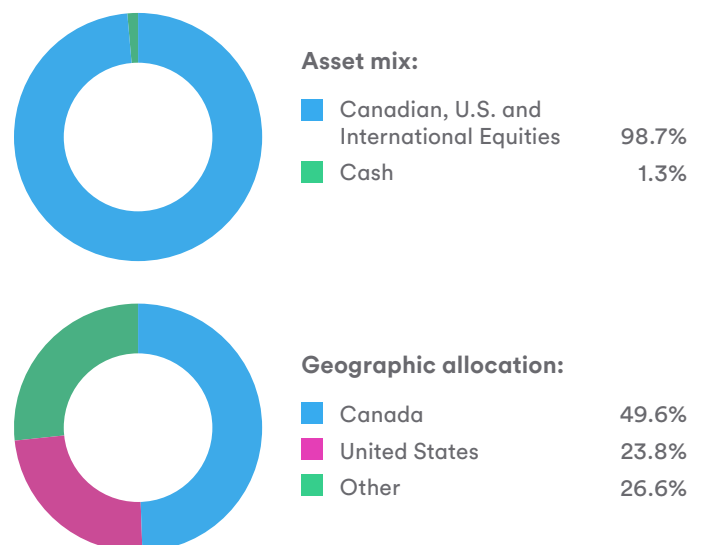
The Canadian dividend component seeks to replicate the MSCI Canada High Dividend Yield Index, the US component seeks to replicate the MSCI USA High Dividend Yield Index, and the EAFE component seeks to replicate the MSCI EAFE High Dividend Yield Index.

How risky is it?

The value of the Fund can go down as well as up. You could lose money.

One way to gauge risk is to look at how much a fund's returns change over time. This is called "volatility".

In general, funds with higher volatility will have returns that change more over time. They typically have a greater chance of losing money and may have a greater chance of higher returns. Funds with lower volatility tend to have returns that change less over time.

They typically have lower returns and may have a lower chance of losing money.

Risk rating

Tangerine Investment Management Inc. has rated the volatility of the Fund as **medium**.

Because this is a new fund, the risk rating is only an estimate by Tangerine Investment Management Inc. Generally, the rating is based on how much the fund's returns have changed from year to year. It doesn't tell you how volatile the fund will be in the future. The rating can change over time. A fund with a low risk rating can still lose money.

No guarantees

Like most mutual funds, this Fund doesn't have any guarantees. You may not get back the amount of money you invest.

How has the Fund performed?

This section tells you how units of the Fund have performed since inception. Returns are after expenses have been deducted. These expenses reduce the Fund's returns.

Who is this Fund for?

The Fund is for investors who seek capital growth potential and dividend income, and are comfortable with the level of risk shown here. The Fund is suitable for investors with a longer-term time horizon.

A word about tax

In general, you'll have to pay income tax on any money you make on a fund. How much you pay depends on the tax laws where you live and whether or not you hold the fund in a registered plan such as a Registered Retirement Savings Plan or a Tax-Free Savings Account.

Keep in mind that if you hold your fund in a non-registered account, fund distributions are included in your taxable income, whether you get them in cash or have them reinvested.

How much does it cost?

The following tables show the fees and expenses you could pay to buy, own and sell units of the Fund. The fees and expenses – including any commissions – can vary among series of a fund and among funds. Higher commissions can influence representatives to recommend one investment over another. Ask about other funds and investments that may be suitable for you at a lower cost.

1. Sales charges

There are currently no sales charges payable when you buy, switch or redeem units of the Fund.

2. Fund expenses

You don't pay these expenses directly. They affect you because they reduce the Fund's returns.

The fund's expenses are made up of the management fee, operating expenses, trading costs and fixed administration fee. The annual management fee is 0.80% of the Fund's value. The annual fixed administration fee is 0.15% of the Fund's value. Because this Fund is new, its operating expenses and trading costs are not yet available.

More about the trailing commission

The trailing commission is an ongoing commission. It is paid for as long as you own the Fund. It is for the services and advice that your representative and their firm provide to you.

Tangerine Investment Management Inc. pays the trailing commission to your representative's firm. It is paid from the Fund's management fee and is based on the value of your investment. A trailing commission is up to 0.4% of the value of your investment each year in recognition of the services provided. If you invest \$1,000 annually, a 0.4% commission would equal to \$4.00.

3. Other fees

You may have to pay other fees when you sell or switch units of the fund.

What if I change my mind?

Under securities law in some provinces and territories, you have the right to:

- withdraw from an agreement to buy mutual funds within two business days after you receive a simplified prospectus or Fund Facts document, or
- cancel your purchase within 48 hours after you receive confirmation of the purchase.

In some provinces and territories, you also have the right to cancel a purchase, or in some jurisdictions, claim damages, if the simplified prospectus, annual information form,

Fund Facts document or financial statements contain a misrepresentation. You must act within the time limit set by the securities law in your province or territory.
